

How to download and save .mp3 files for mp3 players:

## **WINDOWS:**

### **Method 1:**

#### **Explorer:**

"Right click" on the .mp3 file link. From the pop-up (contextual) menu, select "Save target as..."

A dialog box will appear, allowing you to save the file on your hard disk.

From there, double-click the .mp3 file, which will play in your default .mp3 player.

#### **Firefox:**

"Right click" on the .mp3 file link. From the pop-up (contextual) menu, select "Save link as..."

A dialog box will appear, allowing you to save the file on your hard disk.

From there, double-click the .mp3 file, which will play in your default .mp3 player.

### **Method 2 (Explorer or Firefox with Quicktime Plug-in installed):**

Click on the file link in your browser. The file will load and play through the browser using Quicktime. Once the file downloads, choose File --> Save Page As... (or hit Control-S) and in the dialog box, save the mp3 file onto your hard disk.

From there, double-click the .mp3 file, which will play in your system's default .mp3 player.

## **MACINTOSH:**

### **Method 1:**

#### **Safari:**

Control-click the .mp3 link in your browser, and you'll get a pop-up (contextual) menu. Choose "Open with iTunes" and the .mp3 will save and play in iTunes.

If you use a different .mp3 player, choose "Download linked file" from this pop-up menu. In the dialog box, choose where you want to save the .mp3 file to your hard disk. From there, you can drag and drop the file onto the iTunes interface or an .mp3 player of your choice.

#### **Firefox:**

Control-click the .mp3 link in your browser, and you'll get a pop-up (contextual) menu. Choose "Save Link As..." and in the dialog box, choose where you want to save the .mp3 file to your hard disk.

From there, you can drag and drop the file onto the iTunes interface or an .mp3 player of your choice.

### **Method 2 (Safari or Firefox with Quicktime installed):**

Click on the file link in your browser. The file will load and play through the browser using Quicktime. Once the file downloads, choose File --> Save As... (or hit Command-S) and in the dialog box, save the mp3 file onto your hard disk.

Then drag and drop the .mp3 file to iTunes or an .mp3 player of your choice. (Or double-click the .mp3 file to play it in your system's default .mp3 player).
